This tank served in the Italian army after 1945

Serial Number 6143, built by Fisher in July, 1943. This tank served in the Italian army after 1945, the original diesel engine was replaced with a radial one

M10 GMC – Armor Academy and military base, Camp HuKou, HuKou (Taiwan)
This tank shows all the signs of having formerly been a HMC with the Japanese Type 91 howitzer. The wider aperture cut in the mantlet to accommodate the howitzer has been plated over and either a plain tube or a 76mm gun M1 (from an M18?) installed ("Costas_TT")

M10 GMC – Armor Academy and military base, Camp HuKou, HuKou (Taiwan) The gun and mantlet are fake. This tank could have formerly been a HMC with the Japanese Type 91 howitzer, reconverted back to M10 TD configuration for display purposes

M10 GMC – Fort Lee U.S. Army Ordnance Museum, VA (USA)
Serial Number 6196, built by Fisher in August, 1943 (USA AFVs register). Previously displayed in Aberdeen Proving Ground, MD. Used by US forces in Europe between 1944 and 1945. After the war, it was turned over to the Italian Army and used for several years, and then donated to the Ordnance Museum in 1967, according to the Ordnance Museum Guide CD (and the draft 1990s Official Ordnance Museum Guidebook) claims that "the 3-inch gun on this, and other Italian M10s, were shortened by the Italian authorities and a counterweight collar was added to restore balance." However, only two other similar Italian examples (in Cassino and Monte Lungo) have been found (out of many others in Italy without shortened barrels), and it appears more likely that the shortened barrel and collar is the result of demilitarization (USA AFVs register)

M10 GMC – WW2 armor collection, FL (USA)

Serial Number 1223, manufactured by Fisher in February, 1943. Previously part of the American Heritage Museum in Hudson, MA. This tank is an Israeli post-war conversion, done in 1957 using captured 17-Pdr guns and ammunition. It was used as a training vehicle. It is being restored back to original M10 condition
