Serial Number 37, original Registration Number 4055526. This M12 GMC is the last survivor of the 100 ever produced (USA AFVs register). The vehicle carries the markings of "Adolph's Assassin", an M12 of the 991st Field Artillery Battalion, 1st Army, which served in Europe during WW2

M40 GMC "Alta's Ankles" — National Guard Armory, Mena, AR (USA) RN 40194772 stamped on the front glacis. It was displayed for years up at the local lodge but was moved to the AR National Guard Armory on Morrow St N, North of 71. A Sgt from the Armory came out and gave a little history of the vehicle. When it was delivered to the Armory in the 1980s, it rolled off of the lowboy and crashed into a tree. The tree was taken out and the upper right rear of the M40 was slightly bent ("vagabond")
