M4(75) Sherman – Allen Crawford collection (UK)

Serial Number 551, built by Pressed Steel Car in September, 1942. Comes from Feldom, Catterick Training Area. Former M4E9, has got British WD number T270129

M4(75) Sherman – Netherlands War Museum, Overloon (Netherlands) Serial Number 15499, manufactured by Baldwin LW in May, 1943. On the Hattertweg Vierlingsbeek, Netherlands (4 October 1944). This M4 received two direct hits from a 75mm gun on the lower right side of the hull, and one from the 88mm gun on the bottom right edge of the turret. There is a corresponding exit hole for one of the 75mm penetrations on the lower right side of the hull. The crew were killed and are buried in the American cemetery of Henry-Chapelle near Verviers in Belgium ("Panzerpicture")

M4(75) Sherman – National War and Resistance Museum, Overloon (Netherlands)

Serial Number 24871, built by ALCO in July, 1943. This tank, nicknamed "Cookie", is said to have been a combat casualty of the 31st Tank Battalion, 7th Armored Division, put out of action during the Battle of Overloon in October 1944. It was displayed in Ortona, Italy for a few years, before being transferred back to Overloon

M4(75) Sherman – Wiltz (Luxembourg) Serial Number 30270, RN 3038800, manufactured by Pullman Standard in May, 1943. This tank belonged to HQ, B Company, 707th Tank Battalion. On 16 and 17 December, 1944, the 707th TB fought in Marnach area, near Clervaux, where it suffered heavy losses. On 18 December, the surviving tanks were ordered to withdraw to Wiltz area. This tank was abandoned in Erpeldange (near Wiltz) on 19 December. It was defending the Weidingen bridge before the US Engineers blew it up. While manoeuvring and looking for a good shooting position, the tank fall in a slurry pit in front of a farm, and got stuck. Shortly thereafter, all the crew was captured by German soldiers. In 1946, the tank is cleared from the pit and moved to Wiltz city center to remain as a monument (book "Les témoins d'acier" by Hughes Wenkin and Christian Dujardin)

M4(75) Sherman – Musée des Blindés, Saumur (France) Serial Number 811, built by Pressed Steel Car in November, 1942. Has a riveted lower hull

M4(75) Sherman Dozer – D-Day Underwater Wrecks Museum, Commes (France) This is possibly the last complete WW2 Sherman Dozer (all the other complete examples are thought to have had the blade installed after the war)

M4(75) Sherman – Normandy Victory Museum, Catz, near Carentan (France) Previously displayed at the 1^{ère} Brigade Mécanisée, Châlons-en-Champagne (France). Serial Number 1940, built by Baldwin LW in February, 1943

M4(75) Sherman – Centre de Formation Initiale Militaire (CFIM), Bitche (France) Serial Number 11158, built by Pressed Steel Car in January, 1943

M4(75) Sherman – MM Park, La Wantzenau (France)

Serial Number 2168, built by Baldwin LW in April, 1943. Has remains of the deep fording kit equipment on the rear. Currently has a 75mm turret that comes from an M4A1 Sherman built by Pressed Steel Car in November, 1943. This turret has the remains of Duplex Drive modification fittings, so it comes from a Duplex Drive M4A1 Sherman

M4(75) Sherman – La-Valette-du-Var (France)

SN 15666, built by Baldwin LW in July, 1943. The dozer blade was removed, but the fittings are still present on the glacis and driving train. This tank was previously part of the Saumur Tank Museum, where it displayed a dragon face paint on the front glacis (as found on tanks that fought during the Korean War)

M4(75) Sherman – Museo di Carristi, Rome (Italy)

Serial Number 15981, built by Baldwin in October, 1943. Former Firefly converted back to a 75mm Sherman. The serial number, direct vision slots and vertical rear hull plate indicate this is an M4 manufactured by Baldwin Locomotive, probably in October 1943 (K. Laughlin). It has features characteristic of a British Firefly conversion, including mounting pads for methyl bromide extinguishers ahead of the tail lights, brackets for a 17pdr towing spring, lugs for the 17pdr gun crutch on the rear deck, remains of the weld from the bow MG plug, a British cupola, and a Number 19 radio set antenna on the turret rear ("tankbarrell" and "recceboy")

M4(75) Sherman – Gainesville, TX (USA) Formerly located at the Midland Army Airfield Museum Hangar, Midland, TX (USA). Built by Pressed Steel Car



Colonel Renato Rocha, commanding officer of 1º Regimento de Carros de Combate, August 2018

M4(75) Sherman – 1º Regimento de Carros de Combate (1º RCC), Santa Maria (Brazil) Serial Number 1801, manufactured by ALCO in April, 1943 (Colonel Renato Rocha). This is a Brazilian WW2 Lend-Lease tank. It has been restored to running condition

It was operated by 3rd Coy/1° BCC until 1972. After that, it was sent to 9° Regimento de Cavalaria Blindado (9° RCB) (Colonel Rocha)

M4(75) Sherman – Wibrin (Belgium) Manufactured by ALCO. The story goes that the M4 was "saved" from a scrapyard by the local priest. It was placed on the spot where it stands today as a remembrance for the liberators of the village (Belgium AFVs register) Not included in this list, all these vehicles can be found there : <u>Sherman Firefly tanks : Sherman Ic, Sherman Hybrid Ic, Sherman Vc</u>

Sherman Ic – Pretoria Regiment base (on Magasyn Road), Salvokop, Pretoria, Gauteng province (Republic of South Africa)

Sherman Ic – Regimiento de Infanteria Aerotransportado 14, Cordoba (Argentina) Serial Number 16090, built by Baldwin Locomotive Works

Sherman Ic – Cuartel del Regimiento de Infantería Mecanizado 5 y del Regimiento de Caballería de Tanques 1, Villaguay City, Entre Ríos (Argentina) Built by Baldwin Locomotive Works

Sherman Ic wreck – Staman International Trading, Nijverdal (Netherlands)

Sherman Ic hull – Heintz Barracks, Bastogne (Belgium) SN 16041, built by Baldwin in October, 1943. The turret was given to the Armoured Weapons Museum, Land Forces Training Centre, Poznań (Poland) in March 2011 (AFV News forum)

Sherman Ic hull – Groot Schietveld Range, Brasschaat (Belgium) Sherman Ic hull – Groot Schietveld Range, Brasschaat (Belgium) SN 16276, built by Baldwin in January, 1944. Hull heavily damaged by anti-tank weapons (Michel van Loon)

(Former) Sherman Ic – Museo Storico dei Carristi, Rome (Italy) Serial Number 15981, built by Baldwin LW in October, 1943. Former Firefly converted back to a 75mm Sherman. It has features characteristic of a British Firefly conversion, including mounting pads for methyl bromide extinguishers ahead of the tail lights, brackets for a 17pdr towing spring. Jugs for the 17pdr gun crutch on the rear deck remains of the weld from the how MC plug. A British cupple

for a 17pdr towing spring, lugs for the 17pdr gun crutch on the rear deck, remains of the weld from the bow MG plug, a British cupola, and a Number 19 radio set antenna on the turret rear ("tankbarrell" and "recceboy")

(Former) Sherman Ic – Dickie Fritz Moth Hall, Dickie Fritz Avenue, Edenvale (Ekurhuleni), Gauteng province (Republic of South Africa) Serial Number 25389, built by ALCO in September, 1943. The turret, gun and mount come from a Sherman 105mm

(Former) Sherman hybrid Ic – Sandstone Heritage Trust, Free State prov. (South Africa) This Sherman now carries a 105mm turret and howitzer instead of the modified 75mm turret with the 17 Pdr main gun

M4 hull with Firefly turret – Near the Police Station, Hechtel (Belgium) The SN is 4060, it was build by ALCO in April 1943 (Michel van Loon)

M4 Sherman Repotenciado – Escuela de Suboficiales "Sargento Cabral", Campo de Mayo, Buenos Aires Province (Argentina)

M4 Sherman Repotenciado – Base of Regimiento 10 de Caballería de Tanques, Azul, Buenos Aires Province (Argentina) Serial number 3948, built by American Locomotive Co. (Jim Goetz)

M4 Sherman Repotenciado (030-01) – Regimiento Escolta Presidencial (President's Guard Regiment) base, Asunción (Paraguay) – running condition Serial number 15919, made by Baldwin (Jim Goetz)
