"On another visit to Johns, he informed me that one of the M3 wrecks was actually the remains of a Yeramba. The large metal box section mounted to the hull behind the 3 piece final drive is a support for the 25 pdr and you can see part of the added Yeramba armour on the rear bulkhead between the engine bay and the open fighting compartment. At the time I thought these were modifications made by farmers post army service, until being set straight by the very knowledgeable John Belfield" ("Luke")
